Good morning, Church. Daily Reading, Luke 1.

Psalm 35:9-10 "Then I will rejoice in the LORD. I will be glad because he rescues me.

With every bone in my body I will praise him:

"LORD, who can compare with you?

Who else rescues the helpless from the strong?

Who else protects the helpless and poor from those who rob them?" (NLT)

In the beginning verses, David reaches out to the Lord for protection. He asks the Lord to fight with those who fight against him. For God to take down those who chased after him. For God to catch them by surprise and trap them in the snares they set for him.
