

Good morning, Church. Daily Reading, Psalm 133.

For Thursday, September 5th.

Hebrews 2:1 "We must pay closer attention, therefore, to what we have heard, so that we do not drift away." (BSB)

Look away for a moment, and you miss that big chunk of ice break off the massive glacier. You miss the otter poke its head out of the water. You miss the whale breach. Or you miss the dolphins surface. (Yes, it is easy to miss out.)

Drifting away from the presence of God causes us to miss out on blessings and the moments God reveals His glory. I mentioned that God is always at work, and I totally believe that. But that does not mean we always get to experience all He has for us as we choose to look away or drift away from His promises.

We are called to keep our eyes on Jesus. To run our own race that honors the Lord. Or, as some have said, "To keep the main thing the main thing." And, that is always staying close to Jesus.

King Saul took his eyes off God, and God removed His blessings. Solomon took so many wives that they led him to drift away from God. Jonah wanted to do his own thing, and God had to redirect him. At times, drifting is easy, and leads us to place our trust in and attention on ourselves, others, work, success, and these can become the gods we serve, and not the One who sustains us.

Don't drift from God. Stay connected to the giver and sustainer of life.
